### Charge 1 – Mission Statement

ℵ The Body Art Committee has developed a mission statement as follows:

ম The BAC will identify current issues in body art material manufacturing, labeling and use. Through a process of collaboration, discussion and sharing the Body Art Committee will create documents that are useful to regulated industries, regulatory agencies and academic institutions, worldwide.

<u>Recommendations</u>: The Body Art Committee will use the above mission statement to guide continued work.



#### Charge 2 – Tattoo Ink and Permanent Cosmetic Labeling Guide

<u>Charge 2</u>: Complete work on the AFDO Body Art Committee Tattoo Ink Labeling Guide.

Discussion: This charge will be carried over to 2018-2019. The committee has spent time working through points of contention between industry and regulators. This is the process.

Applicable to tattoo ink, tattoos, permanent make-up, microdermapigmentation, micropigment implantation, microblading, dermagraphics and cosmetic tattooing.



#### Charge 2 - Critical Points of Contention

#### <u> Industry</u>:

- *σ* Costs to industry
  - ষ Changes to existing processes
  - ষ Color additive for "injection" safety studies
  - ন্থ Too expensive -> may do more harm than good
  - ন্ব Grants?
- $\sigma$  Is tattoo ink a cosmetic?
  - ষ Modernization of Cosmetic Regulation Act of 2018
- $\sigma$  Is the process of tattoo ink application "injection"?
- *σ* Timeline for implementation



#### Charge 2 - Critical Points of Contention

#### **k** Food and Drug Administration:

- FDA considers tattoo ink and permanent make-up as color additives as well as cosmetics and has issued a policy statement covering this perspective.



### Charge 3 – AFDO BAC Web Portal

- Charge 3: Develop and execute, with the assistance of the AFDO Office, a web based portal for information related to body art safety, regulation and other issues of importance to the body art community.
- ► <u>Discussion</u>: This web portal has been established by the BAC and AFDO Staff. Final documents as well as literature pertinent to the BAC is to be posted in this portal.

#### **<u>k</u> <u>Recommendations</u>**:

- ø Education on current work by the BAC, industry trends, and issues related to body art.
- Position needs to be established within the committee to oversee and manage the content of the web portal. No working documents will be available on the web portal.
